

## Tasmania State Stimulus Measures (as of 30.03.2020)

1. Three-year interest free loan to SMEs in industries that have been heavily impacted, and a range of payroll tax exemptions for the remaining four months of the 2020 financial year.
2. Payments of up to \$1,000 will be made to families who are required to enter into self-isolation as a result of the virus.
3. The Tasmanian Government introduced the Small Business Support Package providing eligible small businesses an immediate \$2,500 Small Business Emergency Support Grant, plus to assist the longer-term impact \$15,000 grants will be available for businesses that are experiencing severe financial hardship.
