### **2020 Catastrophe Reporting Form**

The Florida Office of Insurance Regulation (OIR) has released the final 2020 Catastrophe Reporting Form (CRF), located [here](#).

In the event of a hurricane or other natural disaster causing catastrophic damage in the state of Florida, OIR may institute a data call using the CRF for the purposes of collecting claims and other relevant information from insurance companies related to the event. This authority is mandated pursuant to section [624.307](#), Florida Statutes.

The CRF provides valuable information to OIR and the state of Florida regarding the impact of a hurricane or other event. It is critical that data is submitted is timely and accurately.

The OIR hosted a Technical Assistance Webinar to review all fields within the 2020 Catastrophe Reporting Form (CRF) on May 15, 2020. This webinar was provided as a resource to companies to highlight changes from the 2019 CRF, address frequently asked questions, and provide general guidance on accurately completing the form.
